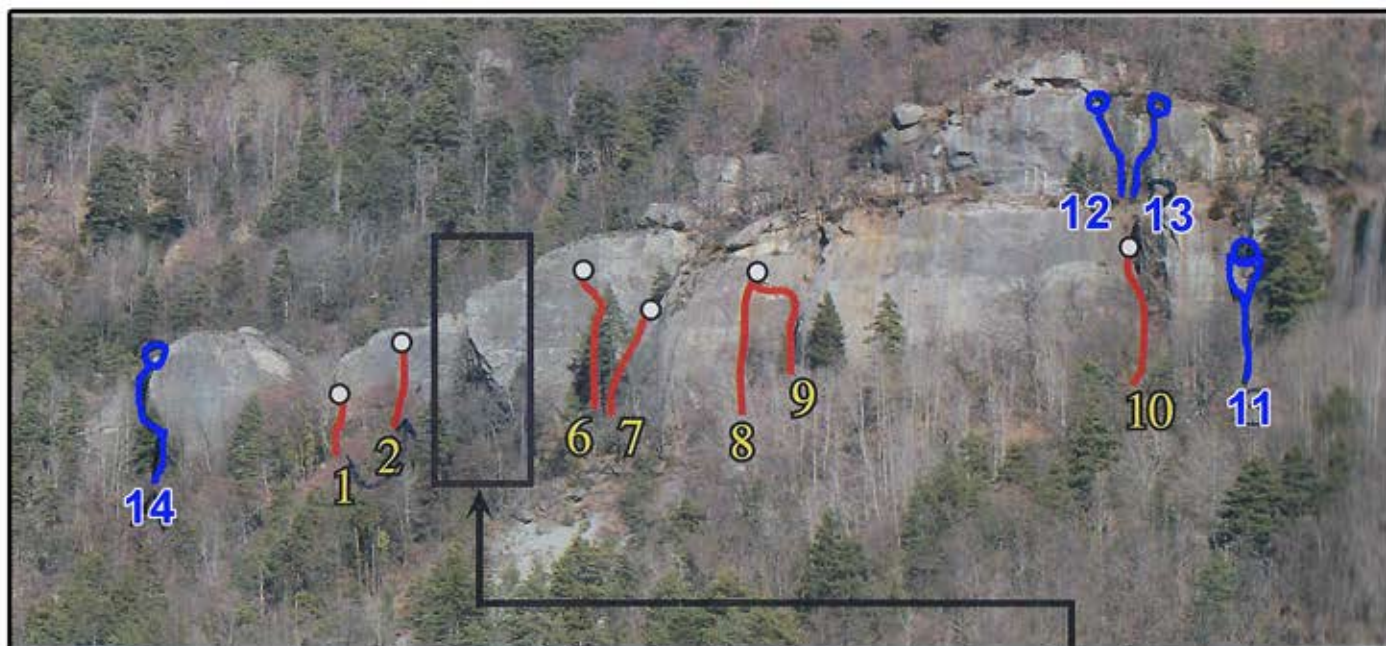


Escalade Trad Annot

Secteur Off-Width Paradise - NEW ROUTES



11. "Hangover" 6C (K. Schrijvers & N. de Jonge 2013) – Right hand side (LH-side is still a project) – The route starts with a squeeze chimney to a roof (often wet), continue in the righthand crack, the crux is a reachy tight hand move to a flaring crack. Two bolt anchor on the left.

Recommended rack: BD # 0.4 to # 0.75 and doubles on # 1-2, one # 3 and one #6.

Sector "Wall Of Early Morning Light":

12. "First Sunlight" 5+ (N. de Jonge & K. Schrijvers 2013) – Beautiful hand to fist crack in a left facing corner ending with a off-width section on a slab. Two bolt anchor in place (don't climb above it!).

Recommended rack: BD# .75 to 5

13. "Dawn Roof" 6C (N. de Jonge & K. Schrijvers 2013) – Short moderate roof travers followed by a finger beating lie-back crack (often wet).

Recommended rack: BD# .3 to 3

Sector left of Off-width Paradise:

14. "Changing Corners" 7A+ (N. de Jonge & K. Schrijvers 2013) – Impressive line consisting of very delicate slab climbing and finishing with a brutal Off-width!

Recommended rack: Double-ropes (mandatory!) BD# .4 to 1 (first section) & # 2 to 5 (second part) Tip: untie rope 1 on the ledge and haul up the big pieces with rope 2 for the Off-width finish.

15. "Squeeze Please" 6B (K. Schrijvers & N. de Jonge 2013) – Which side in with your chickenwing?

Very fun squeeze! Slings tree for an anchor.

Recommended rack: BD # 2 to 6 (double)

16. "Royal with Squeeze" 7B (N. de Jonge & K. Schrijvers 2013) – The ultimate squeeze problem? The crux consist of an imposing squeeze roof. Which side in, maybe a double-chicken-wing?

Recommended rack: BD # .75 to 6 (double on 6) place .75 after squeeze crux to cover the rope-eating flake!
